

A NOAA WEATHER RADIO CAN SAVE YOUR LIFE

Most tornado deaths occur after dark - often late at night without warning. One method to receive notification of a severe weather watch or warning at night is by using a NOAA Weather Radio with a tone alert feature. NOAA Weather Radio receivers can be found at many retail outlets, including electronics, department, sporting goods, and boat & marine accessory stores and catalogs.

PROGRAMMING YOUR NOAA WEATHER RADIO

NOAA Weather Radios are equipped with "**SAME**" technology. "**SAME**", or *Specific Alert Message Encoding* allows you to specify the particular area for which you wish to receive alerts. Most warnings and watches broadcast over NOAA Weather Radio are county- or independent city-based (parish-based in Louisiana), although in a few areas of the country the alerts are issued for portions of counties. Since most NWR transmitters are broadcasting for a number of counties, SAME receivers will respond only to alerts issued for the area (or areas) you have selected. This minimizes the number of "false alarms" for events which might be a few counties away from where you live.

Here is the information you may need to program your NOAA Weather Radio for Indian River County:

1. SAME # 012061
2. Frequency #162.425
3. NWR Transmitter – Ft. Pierce
